#### FROM THE CHAIR

I'm always impressed when I hear of instances of a caller stepping in to help another caller when a problem has made it impossible for him to meet an assignment and I'm encouraged by reports of callers working together unselfishly for the good of the activity. One instance which stands out in my mind was the time an area, which had over 100 callers, presented a gigantic square dance with slots for only 30 callers on the program. The callers themselves selected who would represent them and virtually all other callers showed up with their dancers to participate. That's cooperation!

Now word comes from several areas telling how callers, through their local callers association, after studying their particular area, are emphasizing one CALLERLAB program that best seems to fit the needs of their dancers. Sacramento (California) Callers Association, for example, last month unanimously agreed to work together with such a program and we are hearing of similar moves in other areas. That's putting the dancers first.

We appreciate hearing what you are doing, especially when you send along reports with suggested solutions. Communication is going to be especially important this year with discussions and possible decisions made at the Reno Convention regarding CALLERLAB's next steps. The Executive Committee will be meeting in early December and over the coming weeks, we are planning to telephone a random cross-section of CALLERLAB members to get their views on the following three questions:

1. What do you feel should be the major thrust of CALLERLAB? 2. What may we have overlooked in recent years? 3. How do you think we can attract new members and bring back those who have dropped out?

Of course, we can reach only a small percentage of the membership by phone, so if you'd like to be certain your views are registered, please drop me a note at my home address or telephone me and I'll share your thoughts with the Executive Committee in December. ### BOARD OF GOVERNORS ELECTION

Just a brief reminder -- your Board of Governors ballots are due in the home office no later than November 15, 1987 for your ballot to be tallied. If you have not yet done so, please take the time to cast your ballot. The results of this election will be announced in the December issue of DIRECTION. It is important to exercise your right to vote! (Note: Only full members are permitted to cast a ballot.) Also, please note that you must have your name on the outside of the outer envelope in order for your ballot to be considered legal. The purpose of this is to insure that only full members vote. If a ballot comes in with no name on the outside, we try to determine who the sender is by a postmark, but this doesn't always work and we already have two ballots which will not be counted.

# 1988 RENO CONVENTION UPDATE - March 28-30, 1988

Plans are shaping up nicely with most of our panelists and moderators committed to a fine program. We remind you that the Mainstream program comes up for review and we will also be discussing the three programs approved on a trial basis for one year in New Orleans — the Community Dance Program, the Mainstream Bold Faced/Italics and the Combined Mainstream/Plus in 25 weeks. Please discuss these with the dancers and clubs for whom you call and let us know your feelings. If you are unable to attend the Reno convention, send your ideas in writing to the home office so that your views can be expressed and given consideration.

This year our theme is EDUCATE - PERPETUATE. To support this theme, we have four separate interest sessions on Teaching scheduled. We are also having a session on showmanship as well as music again this year. The last time we had a session on taxes was in St Louis in 1978 and Gregg Anderson has agreed to help this year to update everyone on the effects of the new tax laws. All of these will be taped. The voice clinics we have held in the past have also been a very popular topic and this year we have a session conducted by Caller-Coach Jim Mayo. Of course committee meetings will be scheduled and there is a great deal of important committee business to be discussed and decided upon this year.

Exhibit space will be available and letters to potential exhibitors will be sent out shortly after the first of the year. Please note that <u>all</u> exhibitors must stay in the headquarters hotel.

We again urge you to register early and make your room and travel arrangements as soon as possible. If you are flying, please call the United toll-free number -800-521-4041 first and use our special account number 8009D. If you are booking through a travel agent, have them use the special 1988 CALLERLAB Account Number 8009-D and the special toll free number so we get credit for your flight. travel agent's commission is unaffected. By getting many flights on our designated carriers, we are able to use the earned free flights for our Executive Committee for meetings during the following year and thus reduce the costs for our next convention. Last year in New Orleans, we saved more than \$2,500 in airfares we didn't have to buy. With the expected size of the convention in Reno, we should be able to do even better. Since your travel agent still receives the same commission and since the savings to you can be considerable, please support our designated carrier - United Airlines.

### CALLERLAB GROUP LIABILITY INSURANCE UPDATE

As many of you know, our new group liability insurance policy became effective on September 7, 1987. This insurance was placed with Rhulen Agency, Inc. The policy was underwritten by MIC Property & Casualty Insurance Company - Policy No. GL014427. Our insurance coverage has been increased and we are each insured for Legal Liability, Bodily Injury & Property Damage in the combined amount of \$1,000,000. The deductible applicable to this policy has been reduced to zero for the liability portion and for the property damage, it is only \$100.00 per claim.

In addition to the increased liability coverage, we also now have an accident policy for the caller while calling dances and while traveling to and from dances. This policy is with AIG Life Insurance Company - Policy No. SRG 8703579C. Many of you have requested certificates of insurance. These have not yet been received but will be forwarded to those requesting the same immediately upon receipt.

112 F 7 1 13 13 14 All of our USA members, subscribers, associates, Gold Card holders and apprendiction tices are automatically covered under these policies upon payment of their currentdues. This insurance coverage is also available to members of CALLERLAB affili48 ated organizations for a cost of \$20.00 per year per caller to be covered. For more information, please contact the CALLERLAB Home Office. The individual insurance coverage is not prorated. Individuals may subscribe for this coverage from April 1 through December 31 of each year. Coverage is for the period from April 18 through March 31 of each year. This is to enable us to administratively handle the requests for insurance while maintaining the dues structure with appropriate notices going out shortly after the first of the year.

At this time, our Canadian callers have the liability coverage only. Because of the limited numbers of callers in each of the overseas countries and the fact that our contacts are very limited, our overseas callers do not get any insurance coverage as a part of their dues structure.

FUND RAISING DANCES

Darryl McMillan, Chairman of this ambitious project, is especially pleased to report? that several callers have already had much success with their fund raising dances and, in some cases, are planning to have a second dance. Remember, the donation of your time will hopefully result in larger classes, larger clubs, more dancers at your specials and a general upswing in the Square Dance Activity.

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Commence of the State of the St  All proceeds from these dances will be used entirely for Square Dance promotion. Undoubtedly other things will be proposed, but the first thing to be done with the funds generated is the production of a TV commercial to enlighten the general public about our activity. This TV commercial will be available to any and all square dance clubs or callers to have it run on their local or area TV stations. It is anticipated that this will greatly enhance our recruiting capacity.

Ken Ritucci, Chairman of the CALLERLAB Plus Quarterly Selection Committee, is pleased to report that ROCK THE BOAT has been selected as the Plus Quarterly Selection for the period beginning November 1, 1987. Ken also stated that he was extremely pleased with his committee's excellent and enthusiastic response to the past two ballots.

ROCK THE BOAT (Bob Bellville, Author)

Starting formation: Facing lines. Ending formation: Parallel waves. Timing: 12 Ends do their part of a Load the Boat; the Centers Single Circle to a Wave, Fan the Top, and Extend The Tag. Some dancing examples are:

From Static Squares - Heads Square Thru, Swing Thru, Spin the Top, Recycle, ROCK THE BOAT, Ladies Trade, Swing Thru, Turn Thru, Left Allemande.

Heads Lead Right and Circle to a Line, <u>ROCK THE BOAT</u>, Swing Thru, Single Hinge, Men Run, <u>ROCK THE BOAT</u>, Men Circulate, Recycle, Left Allemande.

From a Zero Line (1P2P) - ROCK THE BOAT, Recycle, Right and Left Thru, Pass to the Center, Square Thru Three, Left Allemande.

SINGING CALL FIGURE - Heads Lead Right, Circle to a Line, Forward and Back, ROCK THE BOAT, Recycle, 8 Chain 4 (add words to song here if you wish), Swing your Corner, Promenade, add 16 beat tag.

We wish to advise of the proper usage of quarterly selections. Please note: (3)

- (1) QS calls are not a mandatory part of any program. Dancers are not to be held accountable for selections past or present.
- (2) QS calls should be verbally mentioned and/or physically workshopped prior to being called the first time at an open dance. QS calls are to be used at the caller's discretion.
- (3) Conventions and festivals shall be encouraged to delete quarterly selections from all halls designated. For example, the Mainstream Hall should read MS, not MS + QS or MSQS.

Next month we will be sending out the results of the voting for the Board of Governors as well as the Keep/Drop Ballots for Connect Four from the MSQS and Compress to a Column from the PQS.

Please also note that while Reno may seem a long way off in both time and distance, it was an outstanding convention the last time we were there and your Executive Committee has planned another fine convention for your education and benefit. We hope that you will be able to make it. Don't be disappointed, register now and plan to be an active participant in these important decisions.

Lastly, many of you received reminders for accreditation or renewals of accreditations within the past couple of weeks. Please take the time to get that administrative detail handled quickly so that we may issue you your certificate.
