CALLERLAB will always have more to accomplish and, within its democratic framework, we can agree to disagree with each other. But by working together, great strides can continue to be taken. What we have is something very special. CALLERLAB is working and it will continue to work as each of us recognizes that we must do our part in supporting it and keeping it well and prosperous.

TRADITIONAL DANCE OF THE QUARTER

START

Mona Cannell, Chairman of the CALLERLAB Contra and Traditional Dance Committee, has announced that "TRIPLE ALLEMANDE" has been chosen as the Traditional Dance of the Quarter for the 1st quarter of 1988.

TRIPLE ALLEMANDE

References: Five Years of Sets in Order, Bob Osgood, 1954, Dance Awhile, Harris, Pittman, Waller, 1964, Square Dance Instruction Book, Cliffie Stone's Band, Capitol Records, 1947

Dance Call:

Allemande left and the ladies star Gents walk around but not too far Allemande left and the gentlemen star The ladies walk around but not too far Allemande with the old left hand Right to your partner, right and left grand.

Dance Description:

The dancers do an allemande left and immediately the ladies form a right hand star in the center of the set and turn the star forward (clockwise), while the gents promenade single file (counter-clockwise) around the outside of the set. Turn the same corner halfway by the left and the gents step to the center to form a right hand star and turn the star forward (clockwise) as the ladies promenade single /file (counter-clockwise) around the outside of the set. With the same original corner, allemande left and right and left grand.

Note: The fun in dancing the TRIPLE ALLEMANDE is to get all of the dancers dancing at the same pace so that the figure flows smoothly. Caution the dancers that with the star in motion and dancers moving on the outside in the opposite direction, the corner comes around very quickly and that they must be alert.

INFLATION REEL

Formation: Improper Duple--1, 3, 5, etc. active and crossed over.

Music: Pulse "Bye Bye Blues", Gold Star "Ragtime Annie", or any well-phrased standard* reel.

Intro, With one below (corner) do sa do	8 cts
1-8 With the same lady swing	8 cts
9-16 Put her on your right, go down in fours	8 cts
1/-24 Wheel turn, come back to place	8 cts
25-32 Bend the Line, right and left thru	8 cts
33-40 Two ladies chain	8 cts
41-48 , Circle four	8 cts
49-56 , Once and a quarter more**	8 cts
57-64 Pass thru, NEW corner do sa do (etc.)	8 cts

^{*} For new callers, a standard length piece of music is considered to be one in which the melody plays through one time in 64 beats.

CONVENTION ATTENDANCE REQUIREMENTS FOR FULL MEMBERSHIP

Just a brief reminder to those of you who have not attended a convention since 1984 or in the case of overseas members, 1980, — in accordance with our By-Laws, in order to maintain full membership, it is necessary to attend a convention physically once every four (4) years for those who reside in continental North America and once every eight (8) years for those overseas.

In the event that you find you cannot meet this attendance requirement, we would suggest that you request a waiver for the same. Please put this request in writing stating the reason such a waiver is being requested and forward it to the home office. If a waiver is not requested and granted, your status will be changed to that of a Subscriber until such time as you are able to attend a convention provided, of course, that your payment of dues is current. Should you have any questions regarding this membership requirement, please do not hesitate to contact the home office.

1988 RENO CONVENTION UPDATE

Plans are well underway for the 15th Annual CALLERLAB Convention at the fabulous Bally Grand Reno. This hotel is the same hotel we used in 1982 when it was called the MGM Grand. We again have the same use of meeting space which was absolutely fantastic. We will again have the dinner show for our Monday evening banquet and this is truly a memorable experience. For those of you who own recreational vehicles, Bally's Reno has a campground associated with the hotel and the rates are a very nominal amount. Of course, you must still utilize the full convention packet for meals etc but it could save you up to \$50.00 per day or so.

The program for the convention is filled with many meaty subjects that should be of great interest to all of the attendees. We will have a session on Taxes, one on Your Voice, four separate sessions on some aspect of Teaching, one session on After-parties, one session on Goal Setting, one session on Showmanship & Entertaining the Dancer, one session on Programming, one session on Presentation Skills and one session—on Music. Of course we will have the usual function of an indoctrination session for the Apprentices and others interested in some of the reasons we dance the way we do. A Sunday evening Orientation will familiarize all attendees with where we now are and what to expect during this convention.

All working committees who requested meetings are scheduled for one or more time slots with some very important decisions to be discussed and formulated. All of the dance programs approved on a trial basis in New Orleans will be reviewed as well as voted upon for retention or modification. Thelma Murtha has a full program set up for the partners with an on-going hospitality room.

We have more than 66 separately scheduled functions excluding meals during these three days. Everyone should be able to find multiple interests during any given hour in order to feel productive.

INSURANCE CERTIFICATES NOW AVAILABLE

We just received the insurance certificates in the office and they are now available to those of you who need them in order to secure a hall. We do not name hall owners as co-insured parties nor is the policy a general accident policy for your dancers. It is designed as a protection for you, as a caller, and also provides accident insurance for you while traveling to or from a dance and while at a dance in which you are calling.

Many of you realize how expensive liability insurance is getting to be and we believe that the insurance program we have established for our Canadian and US callers is well worth the small dues fee we charge. The cost of this insurance coverage was not inexpensive, however and the dues will have to be raised for the period beginning April 1, 1988. The dues notices will be sent out sometime during the month of December and we ask that you pay promptly. When we renegotiated the new policy, it resulted in an additional expense to CALLERLAB of \$23,000 and there was no extra assessment to the members.

Some of the reasons we are able to keep the dues as low as they are include: Your prompt payment of dues when billed, your willingness to support the organization in our efforts to expand our caller base, your willingness to attend the annual conventions and your donations of time, talent and money to complete the many projects we have undertaken over the past few years. We truly appreciate your support and solicit your continued cooperation.

CONVENTION COSTS

The costs for the conventions are based upon "guestimates" on how many caller units will attend. A caller unit is defined as a single caller or a caller and his or her partner. Callers who bring a partner to the convention are only charged extra for the actual costs associated with meals and others attendance costs of the partner. With the exception of the Chairman of the Board of Governors and the paid office staff, all delegates including all Board members pay their own expenses for the convention and the hotel rooms. It is true that we do pay expenses for the the Executive Committee meetings other than at the conventions but they, as individuals, give up a great deal of time and in most instances, it costs them a considerable amount of money to serve in this capacity. Why not take the time to thank them for their efforts in your behalf?

FUND RAISING REPORT

Darryl McMillan, chairman of this ambitious project, reports that results are starting to come in with reports of fund raising dances in Colorado, Florida, Nebraska, New Zealand, North Carolina, Ohio, Pennsylvania, Vermont and West Virginia.

All proceeds from these dances are to be donated to the Foundation for the Preservation and Promotion of Square Dancing and are tentatively earmarked to be used for the production of a TV commercial to enlighten the general public about our activity. This TV commercial will be available at cost to any and all square dance clubs or callers to have it run on their local or area TV stations. This should greatly enhance our recruiting capacity.
