Whether your role presently consists of attending our yearly conventions and voting on our future policies; or if the part you play consists of telling others about this organization's accomplishments as well as its goals for the future; or if you are spreading the WORD about CALLERLAB among non-CALLERLAB callers in your area, you are indeed taking an active part in building our organization's future.

it might be that you are serving as a committee chairman or you may wish to become even more involved. Twenty members, the largest number ever, ran for office in our recent Board of Governors' election. The great majority of those serving on the Board at this time have been elected in recent years with only a handful of the present Board members holding office on a continuing basis since the birth of CALLERLAB. If nothing else, this is a clear indication of the willingness of new blood to serve and of veteran leaders to lend them encouragement. This willingness to work for CALLERLAB says much about our activity in general and about the calling and teaching profession in particular.

Even with those who are presently involved in one way or another, there is always opportunity for each of us to do more.

1988 RENO CONVENTION UPDATE

The registration for the 15th Annual CALLERLAB Convention in Reno now exceeds 600 people. To avoid disappointment, we urge you to register soon with us and the Bally Grand.

Our convention program is full and should prove highly interesting as well as educational. The theme "EDUCATE-PERPETUATE" lends itself well to the sessions scheduled. Please note some special additions as noted below.

If you are flying, please use the special convention number with United Airlines -- Account No. 8009-D. The toll-free number is 1-800-521-4041. If you have a travel agent, please refer to the above account number. The agent will earn the same commission -- we will get credit also; thus, future costs are reduced with the corresponding savings passed on to you.

EXHIBITOR INFORMATION

Letters containing information regarding exhibiting at the Bally Grand in Reno were mailed January 4, 1988. If you are interested in exhibiting at our upcoming convention and did not receive this information, please contact Herb Egender or the home office.

The following policy will apply without exception:

- 1. All CALLERLAB callers and those people whose product or service is primarily for use by callers are eligible to exhibit with CALLERLAB.
- 2. All exhibitors <u>must</u> stay in the headquarters hotel -- no exceptions to this policy.
- 3. If an exhibitor is not registered to attend the convention, there will be an additional exhibitor fee of not less than \$50.00.

DIETARY CONSIDERATIONS

If you or your partner have special dietary needs, please advise the home office at your earliest convenience so that arrangements can be made to accommodate you. Please do this even though you may have done this for prior conventions. By notifying us of your specific needs in advance, we will have informed the hotel staff and they will be prepared to meet your requirements graciously.

ATTENTION - ALL FEMALE CALLERS!

For those of you who wish your convention badge to indicate that you are the caller (and not the caller's partner), we will have available stick-on dots to affix to badges. Please request these at the convention registration desk.

ATTENTION - FULL TIME CALLERS!

A special interest session will be moderated by Mike Sikorsky for full time callers. Full time callers are defined as those callers whose principal income is derived from square dance calling and/or related fields. Please feel free to contact Mike Sikorsky or the home office to suggest topics you would like to see discussed. This session will not be restricted to those calling full time — it could prove very helpful to those considering making square dance calling their principal source of income.

ATTENTION - COMPUTER BUFFS!

Clark Baker has agreed to moderate a session on computers at our 1988 Reno Convention. This should be a very interesting session to any of you who presently own a computer and apply it in some manner to square dancing and/or to those of you who are considering doing the same. If you have suggestions to offer regarding this session, please contact Clark Baker or the CALLERLAB Home Office.

CHALLENGE DEFINITIONS

The provisional C-1 Definitions were approved by the Board of Governors through a mail ballot. Copies of these definitions can be obtained by contacting the home office. The cost is \$2.00 per copy.

The Formations Committee has also been discontinued. In the event additional formations or names are required, a special task force will be assigned to accomplish this function. Our thanks to Bill Davis for chairing this committee -- coordinating all the formations was not an easy task. Your hard work is very much appreciated, too!

MAINSTREAM QUARTERLY SELECTION - For The Period Beginning January 1, 1988

Decko Deck, Chairman of the Mainstream Quarterly Selection Committee, announces that "RETAIN YOUR LANE" is the Mainstream Quarterly Selection for the period beginning January 1, 1988.

RETAIN YOUR LANE - John Marshall

Starting formation(s): Parallel two faced lines or parallel ocean waves.

Ends Circulate twice (two positions) as the Centers Hinge. The very Centers Trade to Cast Off 3/4's with the awaiting Ends. Note from author: "May be used from 3 & 1 lines. In such instances, the Hinge is danced as a 'Partner Hinge'."

Ending formation(s): Two faced lines end in two faced lines; ocean waves end in ocean waves.

Teaching Tips: With the exception of the first half turn, the traffic pattern is very similar to the call "Spin Chain Thru - Ends Circulate Twice". The center action should be taught as a total 8 step routine to match the 8 step timing for the circulating dancers. Timing - 8.

Dancing Examples

From Zero Box to Zero Line:

Zero Box to Zero Box

Swing Thru, Boys Run, RETAIN YOUR LANE, Couples Circulate, Bend The Line, Star Thru, Pass Thru, Trade By, Star Thru.

Swing Thru, RETAIN YOUR LANE All 8 Circulate, Boys Run, Ferris Wheel Centers Star Thru and Back Away, Others Lead to the Right.

Singing Call Example: Heads (sds) Square Thru - Dosado to an Ocean Wave - RETAIN YOUR LANE - Right and Left Thru - Swing Thru, Turn Thru, Corner Swing - Promenade.

RESULTS OF MAINSTREAM KEEP/DROP BALLOT

By vote (keep/drop) of the membership, <u>CONNECT FOUR</u> has been dropped from the Mainstream Quarterly Selection list.

The only current Mainstream Quarterly Selection is RETAIN YOUR LANE.

PLUS QUARTERLY SELECTION - Period Beginning February 1, 1988

Ken Ritucci, Chairman of the CALLERLAB Plus Quarterly Selection Committee, is pleased to announce that "CROSS THE OCEAN" has been selected as the Plus Quarterly Selection for the period beginning February 1, 1988.

CROSS THE OCEAN - Larry Letson

Starting Formation: From Facing Couples (assume normal couples for ease of description), women diagonally pass right shoulders and then face right to become ends of right hand waves. As soon as the women clear the center, the men diagonally start to pass left shoulders, but when they meet, they join lefts and single hinge to become centers of the final waves. Timing: 4-6 beats

Examples:

From Lines Facing: Right & Left Thru ... Ladies lead - CROSS THE OCEAN (ends with right hand waves with boys in the center and girls on the end.)

Heads half square thru ... Slide Thru ... Right and Left Thru ... Dixie Style to a Wave ... Men Trade ... Left Swing Thru ... Single Hinge ... Women Run ... CROSS THE OCEAN ... Men Run ... Couples Circulate ... Half Tag the Line ... Men Run ... Left Allemande!

Heads Lead Right ... Circle to a Line ... Right & Left Thru ... CROSS THE OCEAN ... Right and Left Grand!

SINGING CALL FIGURE

Heads Square Thru ... Dosado ... Swing Thru ... Men Trade ... Men Run ... Bend the Line ... Right & Left Thru ... CROSS THE OCEAN ... Scoot Back ... Swing Corner ... Promenade ... Add 16 beat tag.

OVERSEAS MINI-LAB

We are pleased to advise you that implementation of an overseas mini-lab has been initiated. The mini-lab will be held in Australia, June 12-14, 1990. The exact location has not yet been determined; however, it will be in the state of Queensland, in either Brisbane or along the Gold Coast. Overseas members Nev McLachlan, Eric Wendell, and Graham Rigby along with Graham Brandon and David Smythe, CALLERLAB subscribers, will be coordinating details for this mini-lab.

According to a resolution passed by the Board of Governors, the following will be asked to represent CALLERLAB: the Chairman or Vice Chairman, the Executive Secretary or Assistant Executive Secretary, and one to three members of the Board of Governors or recognized caller/trainer leaders or Caller-Coaches.

Those attending the mini-lab from any overseas country will meet the convention attendance requirement if eligible and appropriate. This will not apply to U.S. callers affiliated with CALLERLAB who attend or are on tour. No formal action(s) may be taken which would be binding to CALLERLAB as an organization.
