Music being one of our most valuable entertainment and teaching tools, the selection of music rightfully demands a great deal of our time and effort. The music we choose and how we use it can mean the difference between a great dance, just another dance, or a terrible dance. There are a large number of ways in which one can categorize square dance music. For simplification, I have chosen the categories shown in the key below. You may choose to use (or not) any or all of this music in the manner the panelists have indicated, or in some other fashion that may better suit your style or talents. To get the most from your music, it is important that it "speak" to you. This is a sharing exercise that we hope you will find useful. A recording of this panel will be available for purchase.
